Highlights

Jordan Brown was 2x3 with a pair of solo homers (2nd career multi-HR game). **Mickey Hall** drove in a couple runs despite not recording a hit. On the mound, **Yohan Pino** threw 7.0 shutout innings for his 2nd win in as many chances as a Clipper.

Upcoming Probables

End of the Regular Season

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Hector Rondon** to the mound in the season finale, as the Clippers attempt to win consecutive games for the first time since 7/30 and 7/31 at Lehigh Valley (first time at home since 7/17 and 7/18 vs. Syracuse). Toledo will counter with LHP **Ryan Ketchner**. The Clippers are 15-28 against left-handers this season. Ketchner has never pitched against Columbus in his career.

vs. the Mud Hens

The Clippers and Mud Hens split the season series 11-11 last season. This year, the Clippers are 7-14 against the Hens, 3-7 at Huntington Park. The Clippers loss on 8/22 guaranteed another losing season series against the Mud Hens (last time winning a season series against Toledo was 2003).

Missing Marte

The Clippers are 12-28 (.300) since their Triple Crown candidate, **Andy Marte**, had his contract purchased by Cleveland on 7/28. At the time of his promotion, he was 3rd in average (.327), 2nd in homers (18) and 2nd in RBI (66).

Brown Back in the Batting Battle

Jordan Brown padded his lead in the I.L. batting race (.336) after last night's 2x3 performance. Toledo's **Don Kelly** sits in 2nd at .331. Brown has the potential to become the first batting champ to play for a last place team since **Danny Sandoval** won in 2005 with

International League Royalty

In addition to Brown's quest for the batting crown, **Michael Brantley** is tied with Louisville's **Drew Stubbs** for most steals in the I.L. (46) and **Carlos Carrasco** paces the circuit with 148K (36 with Columbus). With the competition either lagging way behind or in the Majors, both leaders appear poised to end the season on top. Brantley will become the franchise's 8th stolen base champ (most in the I.L. since 1977) and Carrasco is set to be the 7th Clipper to lead the league in strikeouts (2nd most in the I.L. since 1977).

Seven Strong

On the season's final day, Columbus will have only seven active players from the opening day roster. Of the other 22 that started the year with Columbus, 11 are in Cleveland, six have been released or traded, four are on the DL and one is in Akron (**Armando Camacaro**). Camacaro joins **Adam Miller** as the only two players on the Clippers roster that did not appear in a game.

Just Short

Last night **Zach Jackson** threw 2.0 innings, giving him a team-high 99.2 on the season. In the previous 32 season of Clippers baseball, they have always had at least one pitcher reach 100.0IP. **Chuck Lofgren** finished the year in 2nd with 98.1IP.

It's a Fact

Saturday night's loss established a new franchise record (84) as well as guaranteed that the 2009 Clippers will finish with the worst record in franchise history. They come into tonight's game having lost five straight on Mondays (worst day of the season, 5-13).

This Date in Clipper History

9/7/1996

Matt Luke homered twice and drove in six runs during an 8-3 win over the Norfolk Tides. The win completed a sweep for Columbus, before they went on to sweep Rochester in the Governors' Cup finals for their last Cup win (7th). The six wins, coupled with victories in each of the final two games of the '92 Cup, gave Columbus a franchise best eight consecutive post-season wins (55-38, .591, in I.L. playoffs).

So Much For Roster Stability

The Clippers sent **Lou Marson** to Cleveland today as the last move of the season. Through the first month of the season, the Clippers had made only 19 roster moves. They made 62 in May, 24 in June, 42 in August and now 12 in September to run the total to 185 (franchise record is 188 moves, set in 2008).

Who's on First?

In each of the last two seasons, **Larry Broadway** was the mainstay of the Columbus lineup while leading the Clippers in most starts at one position, tallying 110 starts at first base last year and 100 in 2007. So far in 2009, first base has been the most unstable position, with eight players logging at least one game (**Matt LaPorta** leads with 46 games).

Quality Control

Tomo Ohka notched the first quality start of the season for the Clippers on 4/16 at Toledo, snapping the team's seven game streak without a quality start to open the season. **Jack Cassel** leads the team with nine quality starts. On the season, the Clippers have tallied a quality start in 43.3% of games this season (61 of 141). Last year, the Clipper staff made 63 quality starts in 142 games (44.3%) with **Mike O'Connor** leading the way at 13.

Sloppiness in the Field

After playing flawlessly on Opening Day, the Clippers went on to make an error in 10 consecutive games (15 total errors) to drop to dead last in the league in fielding percentage. From 4/28-5/19, they committed just three errors in 18 games, including a 59-inning errorless streak over nine games between 5/3 at Durham and 5/11 vs. Pawtucket. That put them into a tie for 1st with a .980 fielding percentage. They have since dropped to 11th (.976). Last season the Clippers set team records in both fielding percentage (.982) and fewest errors (92), beating out the 1997 squad (.980, 102 errors). This season, Columbus is 26-57 when they make an error and 8-20 when making multiple errors.

Free Baseball

On 5/17 at Scranton/WB, Columbus played their first extra-inning game of the '09 season, becoming the 2nd to last team in the I.L. to play more than the number of innings scheduled. The Clippers have since played 10 more overtime contests and are now 12-19 in their last 31 extra inning games dating back to the start of the 2007 season. Against Louisville on 6/12, the Clippers picked up their first extra-inning win in Columbus since 6/1/06 vs. Toledo (4-2, 12 inn.). That win snapped a seven game extra-inning losing streak at home. They have played a total of 55 extra frames and have been outscored 31-18 in extra innings over their last 31. This year, their 7-4 record (6-1 on the road) in extra-inning games ranks tied for 2nd in the I.L.

Seven Inning Blues

Columbus ranks 5th in the league in double headers this season, playing in seven and posting a 3-10 record (6/5's game two at Charlotte was rained out). They are 2nd in the league in double header losses with 10. So far, they have split one double header, been swept in four and swept one themselves. The offense has averaged 2.2 runs per game in double headers this season (28 runs total).

Man of Steal

After finishing last season with 144SB, the Clippers improved upon their stolen base total for the fifth consecutive season since the 2003 squad mustered only 48SB (2nd lowest total in franchise history). This year the team is off the one steal a game pace, but **Michael Brantley** has had the green light with 46SB, including six multi-steal games. Brantley currently is tied for the league lead in steals (**Drew Stubbs**, Louisville) and is set to become Columbus' 8th stolen base champion.

I.L. Honors

The International League announced on 7/6 that **Andy Marte** was selected as Player of the Week for 6/29-7/5. It was the second straight week Marte was honored, marking the first time since May 2006 that a player has won back to back awards (**Cole Hamels**, Scranton/WB). Marte hit a combined .468 (22x47) with 4HR and 14RBI during the two weeks. **Jordan Brown** was selected as Player of the Week for 5/18-5/24, hitting .519 (14x27) with 3HR and 7RBI, including his first career 2HR game (5/24 at Buffalo). **Matt LaPorta** was the first Clipper this season to be named Player of the Week (4/20-4/26). For his week, the Clipper outfielder hit .520 (13x25), leading the International League with 13 hits, 10 runs scored, and a .613 on-base percentage, including four multi-hit games.

Lovullo Reaches Milestone

Torey Lovullo managed his 1,000th regular season game on 4/24 vs. Indianapolis (W, 9-7). He currently owns a .529 winning percentage in regular season contests (595-530). In the International League, he is 271-296 (.478), managing his 500th game on 6/25 at Rochester (L, 8-7). In the post-season, he has gone 15-12 (.556) with Kinston (2003-2004) and Akron (2005).

Wilson Valdez reached with a bunt single, then scored after three straight walks to break a 3-3 tie (**Chris Gimenez**, RBI).

5/17 at Scranton/WB, 2-1 (8)

Wilson Valdez drove in **Wyatt Toregas** from 2nd to break a 1-1 tie in extra innings.

5/18 at Scranton/WB, 5-4 (11)

Wilson Valdez scored on a pinch-hit double by **Andy Cannizaro** to snap a 4-4 tie.

5/27 vs. Charlotte, 6-4

Chris Gimenez sacrificed **Tony Graffanino** and **Michael Aubrey** into scoring position in the 8th, with each later scoring to break a 4-4 tie.

6/9 at Gwinnett, 6-5 (11)

Damaso Espino scored on a passed ball to untie the game in the 11th after the Clippers sent it to extras with 2 in the 9th.

6/12 vs. Louisville, 2-1 (10)

Niuman Romero scored the game winner with 1 out on a fielding error by **Kevin Barker**.

6/23 at Rochester, 8-7 (10)

Following a 6-run rally in the 8th, the Clippers capped their largest comeback of the season (5 runs) on a **Jordan Brown** single in the 10th, breaking a 7-7 tie.

7/30 at Lehigh Valley, 5-4 (10)

Josh Barfield reached on an error, then scored on a **Wes Hodges** single to give the Clippers the lead.

8/23 at Indianapolis, 2-1 (12)

Josh Barfield led off the 12th with a HR, breaking a 1-1 tie.

9/4 at Toledo, 12-11

Niuman Romero singled in **Mickey Hall** to tie it, then scored the winner on an error.

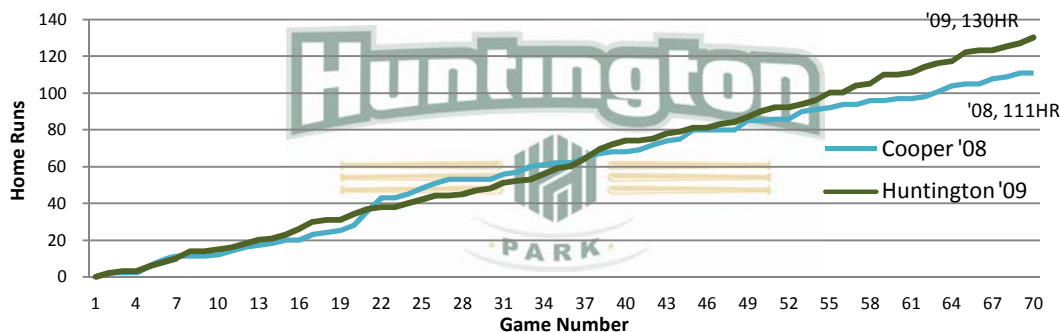

Strong Start to the Season:

To begin the season, Rondon won each of his first five starts and did not allow more than one run in any of them, posting a 1.23ERA (29.1IP, 22H, 4R, 4ER, 5BB, 26K).

Strong Start to the Game:

While with the Aeros, Rondon sported a 0.92ERA (39.0IP, 4ER) in innings 1-3, while holding opposing hitters to a .118 (15x127) average. From the 4th inning on, Rondon's ERA was 4.91 (33.0IP, 18ER) and the opponents hit him at a .328 (45x137) clip. In 11 starts with Columbus, he holds a 3.82ERA (33.0IP, 14ER) allowing a .280 (35x125) average in innings 1-3 (4.28ERA, 33.2IP, 16ER, .288, 40x139 from the 4th inning on).

Out of the 'pen:

This season, Rondon has made two appearances out of the bullpen, going 0-1 with a 9.00ERA (3.0IP, 7H, 4R, 3ER, 2BB, 2K). Both games as a reliever came in back to back appearances with Akron (5/12 vs. Bowie and 5/15 at Altoona). In his career, Rondon has now made five relief appearances (three in 2005 in the DSL).

Triple-A Debut:

Rondon made his Triple-A debut on 7/8 vs. Indianapolis, holding the Indians hitless through 6.0 innings while issuing two walks (tied a Clipper season-high with 8K). Indianapolis broke up the no-hitter in the top of the 7th with a single off **Rich Rundles** (longest no-hit bid for Columbus since 4/9/07 at Louisville, one out in 9th).

Akron Ace:

Rondon was selected to play for the Southern Division in the Eastern League All-Star Game but did not participate due to his promotion to Columbus. At the time of his promotion, Rondon led the E.L. in WHIP (1.06), ranked tied for 3rd in wins (7), 5th in ERA (2.75) and 6th in strikeouts (73). He also ranked 2nd in the league among qualified starters in strikeout to walk ratio (4.6) and strikeouts per nine (9.1). Teammate **Jeanmar Gomez** was selected to replace Rondon.

Protecting the Plate:

Starting on 6/14 at Portland, Rondon strung together 17.1 scoreless innings until the Bowie Baysox struck for a 3-run 4th. In his last four starts with Akron and first three with Columbus, Rondon posted a 4-1 record with a 1.41ERA (38.1IP, 6ER) while holding the opposition to 26 hits in 137 at bats (.190).

Young Gun:

At 21 years and 131 days old, Rondon became the youngest player to appear in a game for Columbus this season when he made the start on 7/8 vs. Indianapolis. However, **Dwight Childs** (born 146 days before Rondon) took over the title of youngest Clipper when he appeared in a game as a defensive replacement for **Wyatt Toregas** on 7/20 vs. Scranton/WB. Rondon is currently the youngest player in the International League.

Limiting the Lefties:

Opposing Eastern League lefties hit .171 (22x129) with 0HR against Rondon and slugged just .248. Righties hit .281 (38x135) with 3HR against him, slugging .415. In the I.L., he has kept the lefties to a .276 (24x87) average (3HR, .448 slugging), while yielding a .288 (51x177) average to the righties (5HR, .458 slugging).

Huntington Park Hero:

Although he has made only seven starts at Huntington Park in his career, Rondon has the most victories in Huntington Park's brief history with four. At the Clippers' new home, Rondon has a 4-2 record with a 2.89ERA (43.2IP, 41H, 18R, 14ER, 7BB, 43K).
