Highlights

Paolo Espino clinched the Governors' Cup for the second consecutive season, tossing 7.0 innings at Lehigh Valley (4H, 1ER, 1BB, 5K). At the plate, **Jared Goedert** was 1x5 with a HR and **Argenis Reyes** went 3x4. **Paul Phillips** was 1x4 with an RBI double.

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Mitch Talbot** to the mound tonight, as he attempts to give the Clippers back to back National Championships. Omaha will counter with RHP **Sean O'Sullivan**. Columbus went 60-29 (.674) against right handers in the regular season (3-1 in playoffs). O'Sullivan has never pitched against Columbus in his career.

Potent Offense

After leading the International League in runs scored during the regular season, the Clippers continued to flex their offensive muscles, leading IL playoff participants in runs (32, more than the other three teams combined). Last year, the Clippers scored 59 runs in eight games of the IL Playoffs and tacked on 12 more in the Triple-A National Championship.

Productive Pitching

In round one of the IL Playoffs, the Clipper pitching staff held Durham, the IL's best hitting team (.271 in the regular season), to a .248 average while allowing just five runs (Durham ranked 2nd with 669 runs). In the GC Finals, they allowed just nine runs, giving them a league-best 2.00ERA in the playoffs (led playoff teams with a 2.33ERA last post season). During the regular season, the Clippers turned in their best pitching performance since 1992, as their 3.94ERA was the first sub-4.00ERA in 18 seasons.

Late Inning Separation

In the playoffs, the Clippers outscored their opponents 14-4 from the 7th inning on, as opposed to 18-10 through the first six innings (10 runs in the last at bat). In the regular season, the Clippers were outscored 198-187 from the 7th on (opponents had 14 more innings after the 7th, due in part to Columbus having the best home record in the IL).

Beating the Odds

Prior to the Governors' Cup Finals, the team that had won game one of an IL post season series had won the series 17 of 20 times, dating to 2006. The series win after dropping game one was the sixth all-time for Columbus, second time in the Finals (also beat Philly's affiliate in 1992, then Scranton/WB).

They All Count

In the series against Lehigh Valley, the Clippers scored half of their runs on plays other than hits (scored once on a ground out, an error and a sac fly, twice on a wild pitch and three times on a walk). In the Durham series 15 of 16 runs scored on hits (one on an error).

Pop the Clutch

Heading into play on 6/26, the Clippers had batted .300 (218x727) and hit 24HR with runners in scoring position through 77 games (53-24). In the next 58 games, in which they went 29-29, they managed just a .197 (95x483) average while hitting 10HR. Over their last nine games of the regular season (6-3), they batted .272 (25x92) with 4HR. In the post season, they're hitting .288 (21x73) with 2HR.

Less Reliant on the Long Ball

During the regular season, home runs accounted for 35.2% of the Clippers' runs scored, as they plated 252 runners due to the long ball (led the IL with 716 runs and 152 round-trippers). In the post season, they have gone deep just four times (twice in each round), resulting in six of their 32 runs (18.8%).

This Date in Clipper History

9/20/2011

The Clippers will play on September 20th for the first time in franchise history with tonight's National Championship. All-time, the Clippers are 3-0 after September 17th, collecting a pair of wins in the 1992 Governors' Cup Finals and one in last year's Triple-A National Championship (12-6 over Tacoma). **Jerad Head** took home MVP honors in last season's game (3x4, 4RBI).

Nail Bitters

On the season, Columbus was 8th in the league in one-run games (42) and 10th in games decided by two or less (66), going 28-14 (.667) and 43-23 (.652) in such games, respectively. They led the league in winning percentage and ranked 2nd in wins in games decided by two or less. In 1-run games, they ranked 1st in winning percentage and 1st in wins.

Picking Up Where They Left Off

In 2011, Columbus continued the trend of spotting runs to the opponent before coming back to win. The Clippers allowed the opponents to plate the first run of the game 67 times (10th in IL), winning 27 times (3rd) for a .403 winning percentage (4th). When scoring first, the Clippers were 61-16 for a .792 winning percentage (wins and percentage ranked 1st). In the post season, they were 5-0 when scoring first and 1-1 otherwise. Last year, they allowed opponents to score first 77 times in the regular season (tied for 2nd), leading the IL in both wins (31) and win percentage (.403).

Team Effort

Despite falling short in their efforts to lead the league in hitting for the third straight year (.264, ranked 3rd in the IL), the Clippers did manage to pace the IL in homers (152) for the first time since 1992. They also led the league in runs scored (716) for the first time since 2003, scoring 47 more times than 2nd place, Durham.

Repeating Problem

Last season Columbus set a franchise record and led Minor League Baseball by grounding into 149 double plays. While not on a record-setting pace this year, they continued to hit into more than their share of twin killings, ranking 5th in the IL with 116.

Record-Setting Staff

On 8/20 vs. Buffalo, this year's pitching staff became the fourth group in franchise history to reach 1,000K (**Joe Martinez**), finishing the year with a franchise record 1,142K (**Mitch Talbot** broke the old record of 1,089 on 8/29 vs. Louisville, game #138). This year marked the second straight campaign in which the Clippers topped 1,000, as each of the four times have come within the past 11 seasons (1,051 in 2010, 1,089 in 2008 and 1,039 in 2001).

Unloading the Bases

The Clippers led the International League in driving in runners with the bases loaded for the second year in a row, piling up 139RBI this season. They hit .298 (45x151) this season, ranking 5th in the IL and had six grand slams (tied for 2nd). Last year, the Clippers hit .354 (51x144) with the bases loaded, smacking two grand slams and driving in 142.

Give Five

The Clippers rallied from a deficit of at least five runs twice this season (trailed Indy 5-0 on 4/25, won 6-5 and trailed Rochester 7-1 on 8/13, won 11-7). Columbus finished the season with 37 come from behind wins, including one in the playoffs (44 last season).

Take Five

Columbus scored five times in 4th inning on 4/24 vs. Indianapolis (16th game of the season), to produce the first 5-run inning of the year (scored at least five in an inning 17 times this season; 22 times last year, including playoffs). From 6/28/09-6/25/11 they had won 33 straight contests in which they had scored at least five in an inning (lost on 6/26 vs. Gwinnett).

Launching Pad

Huntington Park ranked 1st in the IL in homers per game (2.46) this year, with 177 balls leaving the yard in the regular season (100HR by Columbus). In each of the park's first two seasons, it ranked 2nd in the IL (2.40HR per game in 2010 and 1.83 in 2009). In the 2011 post season, a total of three long balls were hit in three games at HP, with Columbus getting shutout (16HR in 2010, 10HR for Columbus).

International Accolades

The Clippers had a pair of players named to the IL All-Star team in **Jason Kipnis** and **Luis Valbuena**, while **Mike Sarbaugh** took home Columbus' second Manager of the Year Award (**Joe Altobelli** in 1980). They had four players selected to represent the IL in the Triple-A All-Star Game (**Jeanmar Gomez**, **Zach McAllister**, Kipnis and Valbuena), joining skipper Sarbaugh in Salt Lake City. In addition, the Clippers had four Players of the Week (**Chad Huffman** 4/18-4/24 & 8/4-8/14, **Lonnie Chisenhall** 6/20-6/26 and **Jason Kipnis** 6/27-7/3) and four Pitchers of the Week (Gomez 6/6-6/12, **David Huff** 6/13-6/19, **Justin Germano** 7/25-7/31 and **Paolo Espino** 8/22-8/28).

Droughts Ended in 2010

In 2010, the Clippers had a winning record, made the playoffs, advanced to the Governors' Cup Finals and won; ending droughts of four, five, 12 and 13 years, respectively (all were franchise highs). Columbus has the most IL Championships (8) since 1977 (the first year of their existence), while ranking tied for 2nd all-time with Syracuse (Rochester leads with 10). In the season following an IL title, the Clippers have had a winning record seven times (only losing year was 1988), made the playoffs six times (missed out in '88 and '93) and won the Cup again four times ('80, '81, '92 and '11).

Manager Profile

Mike Sarbaugh is managing the Clippers for a second straight season in 2011, ending a run from 2005-10 that saw six different skippers in six years (last manager for consecutive seasons, **Bucky Dent** from 2003-05). The 2010 campaign, his first in Triple-A, was a memorable one for Sarbaugh, as he picked up his 500th career win (6/24 at Rochester) on the way to a Triple-A National Championship. As the manager for Columbus, he has compiled a 167-121 (.580) record, while going 13-3 (.813) in the post season. All-time, he has finished above .500 in each of his eight seasons, going 622-442 (.585), while making the playoffs seven times, going 33-10 (.767) and winning five league championships (New York-Penn '04, Carolina '06, Eastern '09 and International '10).

Joey Ballgame:

In the 2011 season, Martinez joined **Chad Huffman**, **Paul Phillips** and **Zach Putnam** as one of four Clippers to remain active for every game (all but Putnam has remained active in the playoffs). The Clippers had 56 different players enter a game in the regular season (31 position, 25 pitchers) and have had four more play in the post season (**Cory Burns**, **Kelvin De La Cruz**, **Juan Diaz** and **Jason Rice**).

Pressed Into Service:

Martinez will be making his 13th straight start, following eight weeks in the bullpen, as he has taken over the rotation spot of **Scott Barnes** (out for the season with an injured right knee). Up until the All-Star break, the quintet of Barnes, **David Huff**, **Jeanmar Gomez**, **Corey Kluber** and **Zach McAllister** had formed one of the most stable rotations in team history, combining to make 78 of Columbus' 92 starts (84.8%). Martinez went on to pass Barnes in starts, picking up his 16th on 9/4 at Toledo (ranked 5th on the team). The top five starters for Columbus ended up starting 107 of the team's 144 games (74.3%), becoming the first team since 2001 to have five guys make over 70% of the starts (nine times in franchise history). Each of Martinez' first two starts this year came as spot starts in double headers and he was inserted into the rotation on 4/30 after **Alex White** had his contract purchased by Cleveland. He made three consecutive starts before heading back to the bullpen as a result of Gomez' option on 5/9. He then made one more start, on 5/22, due to Huff's elbow soreness.

In the Bullpen:

In 19 games out of the bullpen this year, Martinez has gone 4-2 with a 2.84ERA (31.2IP, 32H, 11R, 10ER, 11BB, 26K). He has inherited nine runners, stranding four (44%), while blowing his only save opportunity (6/4 at Louisville; 1.1IP, 1ER in 6-5, 10-inning loss). Martinez has averaged 23.6 pitches per relief appearance this season (high of 39). His outing of 3.0IP on 6/22 at Toledo tied a season-high for relievers (has since been topped).

On a Roll:

In his 14 appearances between starts on 5/22 and 7/17, Martinez went 3-2 with a 2.35ERA (23.0IP, 25H, 7R, 6ER, 9BB, 18K). He surrendered just one homer during that time frame (6/22 at Toledo) and gave up 11HR in 118.0IP this season (one every 10.7P). From 4/18-5/22, he threw 25.1 innings without allowing a long ball, facing 110 batters between homers allowed (on the year, gave up 4HR to Toledo in 16.1IP and 7HR in 101.2IP against the rest of the IL).

Began the season with Fresno... went 1-0 with a 0.90ERA through first two starts (10.0IP, 6H, 1R, 1ER, 3BB, 8K)... won back to back starts on 5/4 at Colorado Springs and 5/9 at Salt Lake City... recorded a complete game win on 6/4 at Las Vegas (9.0IP, 9H, 1R, 1ER, 0BB, 7K)... recalled to San Francisco on 6/11... made only start with Giants on 6/15 vs. Baltimore (L, 6.1IP, 8H, 4R, 4ER, 1BB, 2K)... optioned to Fresno on 6/26... pitched in three games for Fresno, including one relief appearance, going 0-1 with a 4.50ERA (14.0IP, 15H, 7R, 7ER, 4BB, 13K) before being recalled to San Francisco on 7/9... made one relief appearance and was optioned back to Fresno on 7/19... did not appear in a game for Fresno and was recalled to San Francisco on 7/24... traded to Pittsburgh on 7/31 and assigned to Indianapolis... earned first professional save in first appearance with Indianapolis on 8/3 at Norfolk (3.0IP, 3H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 2K)... inserted into the rotation on 8/10 and made four of next five appearances as a starter... recalled to Pittsburgh on 9/1... three of five appearances with Pittsburgh were at least 2.0IP.
